It has been brought to our attention that some children and adults are walking/riding down the center of the road on the way into and out of school. Please encourage your children to remain on the path in order to keep safe.

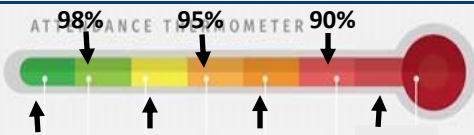
