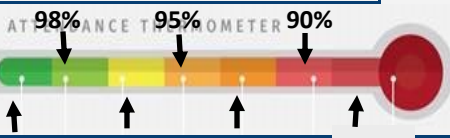

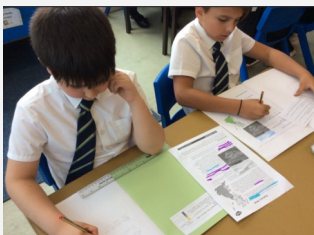
In the future, there will be opportunities for your children to take private instrument lessons. We will bring you more information shortly.

We hope the Rock Band come back and perform for us again. Watch this space!!

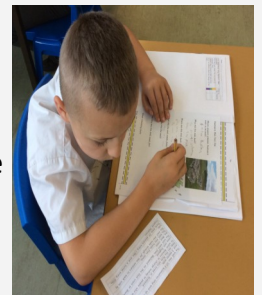


Emperors & Empires

This week Year Three have continued their Emperors and Empires topic. They have been learning about the building of Hadrian's Wall, including how and why the Romans built it. The children were all amazed that the wall was 75 miles long and took over 6 years to build!



The children also learnt about the construction of a Roman fort in Doncaster, or as the Roman's called it Danum. We looked at artefacts that archaeologists have found around the Danum fort and acted as historians discussing what they were, what they would have been used for and what this tells us about the Romans.



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
