Subtraction from 10

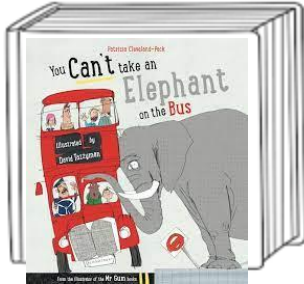

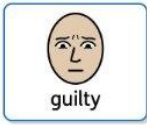


Some activities you could try at home with your child this week:
