SCHOOL BLOG

It's hard to believe we are already four weeks in to a new school year, and what a busy few weeks it has been! Things have been particularly busy in our Lakeside Community Hub with a full timetable of events. Every week we now have over 80 parents/ carers accessing education or support on-site; 30 members of the wider community using the building for community events or social groups; 50 young people accessing the Hub and school site for weekend groups. We are proud of the impact the Hub has had on the local community and we continue to strive to grow what we offer for our school community and the local area, with a particular focus on what we can offer our families outside of school hours at no cost.

The results of the recent parent survey will be used to tailor our offer of after school clubs to suit your needs. Forest School was rated very highly on the survey results and noted as something you would like to access more of, as we begin the building work on our Forest School site this will allow more sessions to take place in and out of school hours. We have worked hard on our Forest School provision over the past five years, this has been confidently led by Mrs Embleton across the school. Mrs Embleton will be leaving the school at the end of next week to move on to a new role as Forest School Practitioner for Doncaster College. I would like to take this opportunity to thank her for all her hard work and wish her well in her new venture. I know outdoor learning and forest life is close to Mrs Embleton's heart and I am sure she will spread the enthusiasm for this across the whole city in the same way she has left a love of the forest as a legacy with the children of Lakeside. We will miss her greatly but I am sure we will see her again in and around school as part of her new role. Lakeside will continue our Forest School journey with two new Forest School Practitioners Mrs Rickwood & Miss Ball, who will work across the whole school providing sessions for our pupils.

We continue to offer a weekly Social Supermarket which runs every Wednesday (one bag per family). You are invited to bring a named cool bag to school and provide a £2 donation via Parent Pay. The produce available will vary each week, with everything from fruit, vegetables, bread, bakery products and confectionery. All of the food on offer is food which has been identified as surplus by local supermarkets, and helps to reduce food waste. This is a great opportunity to access affordable food to help with the rising cost of living, whilst also reducing food waste.

We also have a Hygiene Bank available from the Community Hub and are able to provide cleaning, laundry and hygiene products to families who may be in need of financial support, we are also able to provide food bank vouchers in particular circumstances. We are aware that with the rise in energy prices and the cost of living many families may be struggling financially, if this is the case then please do get in touch with either Mrs Stringer (Family Support Manager) or Mrs Smith (Inclusion Manager) so we can support you and your family.

If you have any suggestions or comments, you can usually find me at the school gate or on the playground at the start and end of the school day, please do come and say hello.

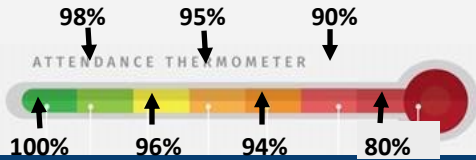
